MEETING MINUTES:

- Called to order by Jerry Corfman, President.

Program: LT Mike Polich – Manitowoc County Boat Patrol

- 2023 the boat patrol had around 250 hours and wrote 26 citations.
- They are paid but officials must volunteer for the boat patrol.
- PFD violations is the most common. Must be coast guard approved and must be the appropriate size.
- Registration violations was the next most common.
- Boat patrol has an 18' Boston Whaler and a 16 1/2' Alumna Craft.
- 920-683-4201 is the non-emergency phone number.
- Other concern areas of boating were battery protection, fire extinguishers and lanyards for jet skis and other boats faster than no wake.

Program: Dave Pozorski (2000 President of MCLA) – Silver Lake & Silver Lake Park

- Silver Lake Park has a history of many public gatherings.
- 2001 a goal was set to remove the rough fish from Silver Lake.
- Muck was also hauled away and the muck contained many foreign objects.
- 1/17/02 MCLA was voted to lead a committee for the project.
- Silver Lake Park Restoration was organized in April 2002 with 21 committee members.
- Goal was to create a place for young and old to enjoy.
- Total park plan project cost was \$185,000.
- It took many years to raise the money.
- Around \$200,000 was raised over 10 years and there was never an administrative charge.
- Trees were removed and new trees planted. Benches were installed. 3 handicap accessible piers were added. Rain gardens were installed and a \$35,000 bridge.

- **Enhanced Wake Size Discussion (Not for Voting)**

Be it resolved that the Manitowoc County Lakes Association (MCLA) supports at a minimum a wake enhancing boat restriction preventing the intentional generation of enhanced wakes within 500 feet from shoreline or island or from any boat, swimmer, or other water user on a lake and in waters less than 20 feet in depth. Be it also resolved that although this resolution is intended for Manitowoc County lakes, MCLA recommends that enhanced wake sizes only be allowed on State of Wisconsin lakes that are 500 acres in size or larger. For the purpose of this resolution a wake enhancing boat means a motorboat that has one or more ballast tanks, ballast bags or other devices or design features used to increase the size of the motorboat's wake. These enhanced wakes are generally created at speeds of 15 miles per hour or less. Note that the intent of this resolution does not prohibit the use of wake enhancing boats on Manitowoc County lakes; it only prohibits the creation of the enhanced wake sizes by said boats via the methods stated above.
